

#### **CEO'S FEBRUARY UPDATE**

#### Hi everyone,

We have a big task ahead of us. The 2023 AOP and KPIs I have set for the Lending and Credit team is very clear:

We need to write PGK 150 million new loans for the year. It may seem like a daunting task, but it is something we absolutely can achieve. Here's how:

- I want PGK 100 million of the new loan to be the 6.5% commercial loan product divided equally amongst the Commercial team and the Branch network.
- The remaining PGK 50 million to be the 4% SME product which is subject to government funding.

Based on the last two years performance, 80% of NDB revenue came from the 6.5% loan product. Yet less than 20% of this was actually funded whilst 80% was the 4% SME Product.

The 4% product is a government policy that is short term and unpredictable. Hence it has huge implications on NDB's loan book and eventually its bottom-line.

Effective immediately, all Lending and Credit employees are directed to focus on sales of the 6.5% Commercial loan product.

All Branch Managers and staff have been given strict targets to meet and I hope that everyone focuses on delivering for our Bank and our people.

Over the next few months, I will run a few workshops, training courses and roadshows to ensure we consolidate our efforts in selling our core product. This way, we can build a sustained loan book and revenue stream for our business.

# **2023 DEDICATION SERVICE**

# The 2023 Dedication Service was led by SDA Pastor, Pastor Yambe bearing the theme "One Team, One Vision."

The key message was Unity and Team Work, stating that nothing can be achieved if we work in isolation, think less of others, don't value the importance of our colleagues and complain if we feel others are not pulling their weight.

The Bible Reading was taken from 1 Corinthians 12:14-31 which talks about the Human Body and how it works. "The human body is a complex machinery which was designed by God himself. It is quite intricate and the level of coordination it has is truly amazing, which is why the scripture uses the human body as an analogy to demonstrate team work." Pastor Yambe said. "If you read the entire text, you will see how the different parts of the body works harmoniously together as a team without complaints and none of these parts think less of each other as each part is important and plays an important role." Pastor Yambe added.

Pastor Yambe reminded staff that there were many lessons to learn from this text

which will strengthen our team to achieve our dreams and visions for the Bank. Some of these lessons can be drawn from the following:

- The Body does not consist of one member but of many
- God arranged the parts of the body. Each of them as he chose.
- These different parts do not complain and compete with each other
- Those parts of the body that we think less honourable, we bestow the greater honour.
- If one member suffers the whole body suffers.

Pastor Yambe shared other examples to further illustrate the value and importance of Team Work.

- 1. Most of us know Magic Johnson but before him there was someone called Phill Jackson and he was also a basketball star and later became a Coach. And this is what he said about Teamwork. "The strength of the team is each individual and the strength of each individual is the team."
- were many lessons to learn from this text 2. Hellen Keller was one of America's

famous female blind educator who became blind at the age of two. Through perseverance she was educated and became a leading blind educator in the United States. Ms Keller said, **"Teamwork divides the task and multiplies the success. Alone, we can do so little, together we can do so much."** 

3. There was a church elder who was quite powerful at the pulpit until one time he stopped going to Sabbath for five consecutive weeks. So Paster Yambe decided to go and visit him. The elder heard about Pastor Yambe's visit and prepared himself. He was in his house cook where he placed the lesson pamphlet on the right side, the hymnal on the left side, the bible on the opposite side with a fire in the middle. When Pastor Yambe and his elders arrived, he invited them in. He thanked Pastor Yambeforvisitinghimandexplainedthat his absence from church did not mean thathehadbackslided. "I'mok, Ireadmy bible in the house, I study my lessons every mornings and evenings, I sing all

### **STAFF DONATE BLOOD FOR POM GENERAL HOSPITAL**

#### Courageous staff from Head Office donated blood responding to POM General Hospital's plea for urgent blood donations.

An appeal was made in the newspaper that the hospital was in dire need of blood supply and needed volunteers to come forward to donate blood. The Marketing Department contacted POM General Hospital and asked them to come to the Head Office as there were staff who were willing to donate blood but were not able to go there individually due to work commitment. Before POM General Hospital Staff came to draw blood, they carried out an awareness. The purpose of the awareness was;

- To talk about the importance of blood donation
- Benefits of a donor
- How often a person can donate blood?

- What must one do to be a suitable donor?
- What must one do before you donate blood
- And give the opportunity for staff to ask questions about donating blood.

Many staff turned up to donate blood who had to do a mini medical check to ensure they were qualified to give blood which included checking the blood pressure, weight and heamoglobin level.

NDB staff have been donating blood for many years and a good number of staff are registered donors with donor cards against their names.

For some it was the first time to donate blood and expressed satisfaction at knowing they are able to save not one but three lives. "I've always had this fear of seeing blood but after someone kept reminding me that my blood donation

was going to save three people, I drew strength from this and walked in to test myself to eventually donate. Infact, I was the last person to donate blood." Maino Vere proudly said.

Another first time donor Wilphraim Roa-Kemo said he never knew his blood type until after participating in the blood donation exercise. "I didn't actually know my blood type till now so thank you very much." Wilphraim said.

Nurse Madlene Aika who led the team from POM General Hospital thanked the NDB staff who donated blood saying while it was staff who volunteer to donate blood, NDB as an organization must be commended for ensuring that every year it opens its doors for their staff to donate blood towards this very worthy cause. Nurse Aika aid they appreciated this kind gesture and looked forward to working with NDB for more blood donations for the hospital.

Chief Executive Officer Johnson Pundari said he was overwhelmed and proud of the staff who turned up to voluntarily donate blood. While the gesture was voluntary, it demonstrated the humanitarian side of the organization. "We are the people's bank and we are mandated to serve our people through funding assistance and providing the opportunity for our staff to participate in this life saving activity is a demonstration of our Corporate Social Responsibility to our people." Mr Pundari said.

### SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT (SHE) REMINDERS

- If your office or workstation is close to the window, try using natural lights. If the natural light is sufficient to get by several hours of the day take the opportunity and do so. If you have blinds, try raising them and see how it goes. The less dependent we are on artificial light during working hours ensures we are promoting sustainability and not just been cost conscious but it's also the right thing to do.
- When you leave your office or work area for a meeting, customer visitation, inspection or lunch, switch your lights and air conditioning off.
- Print in Black and White on both sides if more than a page. Print in colour only if it is absolutely necessary.
- Take extra precaution when traveling to and from work. Whether commuting on public transport, private vehicles or Bank vehicles. Use main roads and avoid hot spots. If walking, avoid unfamiliar short cuts. Your safety is paramount.
- Drivers must be mindful not to use your mobile phones whilst driving. It is now considered a Traffic Infringement with a penalty of K1,000.00 spot fine.
- Head Office Staff: Use the stairs if it only a level up, instead of using the elevator. It saves power and importantly it is good for our health.
